



In this Newsletter edition we are happy to share photos of the sponsored children from 2018. The gift of an educational sponsorship with SFA has changed the lives of many children over the past 8 years.

Our Educational Sponsorship Students

SFA has been running a Sponsorship Program in Western Kenya for 8 years thanks to the generosity of many Canadians. We feel this is one of our best programs. Education is a positive way to bring hope and change to a child's life and to that of their families. It also strengthens and enriches a whole community. Over the years our students have been going from strength to strength and now many have begun high school. Once again this year some of the children will be taking their National exams to graduate in December. This is beyond our initial expectations for them. When SFA began this program our goal was to keep the children in school to complete level 8. The hope was it would prevent them from dropping out in primary school due to poverty or abandonment. We often take education for granted in Canada. We know that in Kenya the possibility of realizing the goal of an education despite their situation is highly valued by our students. We currently have 57 students in our sponsorship program.


Oh Happy Days! Shopping for New School Supplies!

SFA administrator Susan and her assistant Esther are seen helping and involving the children in the purchase of their newly funded school bags, uniforms, shoes and school supplies.

The sponsorship covers the payment of all school and exam fees. The children also receive a nutritious meal served each school day at noon. This meal is essential to their ability to focus and learn.







New Shoes!

Although feet that have never been confined to shoes may not be so happy to be in them, the children and caregivers know the shoes will prevent dreaded parasitic jigger infections.





Sanitary Supplies for Adolescent Girls

SFA supplies the girls in our program with sanitary supplies, underwear and soap to make sure they are not held back from school each month. This is often the case for vulnerable girls who miss one week of classes a month and then fall behind very quickly.





One Nutritious Meal a Day

For many orphaned and vulnerable children, meals are not available in a predictable or guaranteed way. Less than one meal a day is the point beyond which their health and proper development is compromised. Learning does not happen when a child suffers from hunger on a daily basis. SFA sponsors provide one nutritious meal a day to the children in the program. Supplies are purchased in bulk and prepared by a cook on site. The meal is served mid- day at school. This guaranteed meal also lessens the burden on the family or caregiver with one less meal to provide for this child.

Congratulations Kingsley!

Kingsley arrived at his new school with a new trunk full of supplies. Kingsley was rescued a few years ago from a dangerous situation. Kingsley wrote that he was so thankful to have what he called "a reasonable life". He threw himself whole heartedly into this new opportunity and worked hard. He is now a top student, a leader among his peers who loves music and singing. We are proud and happy to say he has earned a partial scholarship at St. Peter's Seminary in Kakamega for his first year of High School. Several SFA donors have joined to make this possible for Kingsley, thank you!

Mentoring Each Other

Our administrator Susan and her assistant Esther make a great team at the head of this Sponsorship Program. They meet regularly with the students to support them and to identify their individual needs or difficulties. They encourage them to stay focused, to work hard and to aim high. They have guided many children through un-expected hardships, dangers or heartbreak which could easily have derailed them. We are very grateful for their caring way with the children. By fostering the values of love and support for each other Susan and Esther have created a close bond within the group.

Meetings of the Shitochi Goat Project



Update from Susan Nanjala

The Goat Project began in Dec. 2015. The project was funded in 2 phases over a one year time frame to ensure good management by the group. One female goat was bought for each of 20 families. Another 4 male goats were bought for breeding.

Out of 20 female goats, 17 have been productive and 3 seem to be infertile. The 17 have produced

24 babies, keeping in mind that fertility rates vary. Some have given birth to 1, 2 or 3 kids. Whenever a need arises in a family, they sell off the young ones and address their most pressing basic needs. Since the election year 2017, the inflation rate is high due to the high taxes imposed on the citizens. The needs most often addressed are food and education requirements for the vulnerable children in the households.

The project is well managed by the members who meet regularly to share stories and updates. We follow up/monitor and give any appropriate advice needed.

Thank you all for your efforts on behalf of the orphans & vulnerable children in our Kenyan projects. You can all be assured that the money raised will be put to good use.


