Shitochi Goat Project: Phase 2 Launches!



Good news! The Goat Project is doing well and the first phase goats are thriving! Four of the first group of goats are expecting babies and the caregivers are doing a great job of caring for their personal goats and the 2 additional male goats for breeding.

SFA is now funding the purchase of the next 11 females and 2 more males so that every member of the group will receive their own goat. We welcome all donors who would like to help us with this project. A female goat costs approx. \$100. Donations of any amount will help also with the construction of sheds for shelters and training of the new owners by a Livestock Specialist. The goats require vaccinations as well. What is CCTD? By Susan Nanjala, Project Administrator



Community Centre for Transformation & Development Program is a local CBO (Community **Based Organization**) based in Western Kenya, Kakamega County. The organization has been in existence for several years focusing on health, water & sanitation, HIV/AIDS and orphans & vulnerable children. Our main partner is SUITCASES FOR AFRICA (SFA). Through our partnership with SFA, hundreds of children and

families have benefited from monthly feeding programs and educational sponsorship programs assisting vulnerable children to go through primary school & high school. Together we also install wells for safe drinking water which improves health for needy families, communities and institutions. For a specific sharing, I will focus on two groups which benefited from feeding programs for several years. The groups are SHITOCHI OVC (orphans & vulnerable children) GROUP and SHAMBERERE ECD School for OVC's. For several years the groups received food rations on a monthly basis which was a boost to family food security. The support improved the nutritional status of vulnerable families mainly affected by HIV / AIDS and poverty.

However, this feeding intervention was not sustainable and in 2015, **SFA** and **CCTD** resolved to assist the groups with sustainable projects that will provide a source of livelihood. After joint discussions, sharing and consultations with the groups, SHAMBERERE chose to venture into the **Sale of Firewood** and SHITOCHI chose to **Raise Goats** at the family level. The two projects successfully kicked off in February 2016:

SHITOCHI GOAT PROJECT update: Report by Susan Nanjala

This first group received 11 female cross breed goats and 2 grade male goats to service the females. Half of the group members received a female goat each and the 2 males were kept by two families. The goats were purchased in February 2016. The families will benefit from the milk as a source of protein. It will also be an income generating activity with the sale of replicated goats. The droppings also provide a source of manure. One of the goats had a kid in the end of July and 4 more are engulfed (pregnant). The members who received the goats are very happy and managing the goats well.

SHAMBERERE FIREWOOD PROJECT Update: Report by Susan Nanjala

The project funds donated were used to assist the group to construct a storage building, purchase a power saw machine, and to have capital to purchase the first trees. This enabled





the group to manage the project with ease. Since the start of the project in February 2016, the following are the achievements:

- A school feeding program has been initiated using money generated from the sale of firewood. The power saw is sometimes hired by locals and this provides a valued addition to the main project.
- 2. Before this project the children were sitting on the dirt floor but now the group has been able to make desks for the children.
- The group was able to lease ¾ of an acre of land and planted maize and beans. The harvest is currently being used for the school feeding program.

This project will assist the community in developing a sustainable source of milk for the nutritional needs of the children. This project will also become a source of income with the sale of surplus milk. The cow is carrying a calf which is a great bonus. They will join the first cow and calf for a total of 4 animals. Shanyinya Community Update



Thanks to the generosity of Air Canada Vacations and an extended family in Canada, the once struggling community of Shanyinya has been assisted by sustainable development over a period of several years. Help arrived first in the form of a community well which was funded by Air Canada Vacations Co. The well was installed in memory of a young girl, Isabella, who died of AIDS and water borne illness. Each year a memorial celebration takes place with child centered events in the community. Over several years through the assistance of an anonymous Canadian family more help arrived. They funded a poultry project, a cow project and assisted in the development of an early childhood center. Their impact helped the community by improving the lives of all, especially the children. More recently they have funded new desks, chairs and school uniforms. Library books and school supplies which were sent in the 2015 container also brought much enjoyment. This spring the funding of warm new sweaters for all the children has completed our work here. The community members have been good stewards of all the projects received and the cows have now grown to four in number. The milk and eggs combined with a small vegetable farming project now provide a meal for the children each day and extra milk, eggs and water are sold to maintain the education center. Though it is always hard for us to say goodbye, we know they are well on their way and SFA must now move on to assist other struggling communities. THANK YOU to our wonderful donors for making all of this support available to change their lives.

Exciting News in our Education Sponsorship Program

When Suitcases for Africa first set up the Educational Sponsorship Program, our goal was to assist needy students with their school fees, supplies, uniforms, books and a small daily lunch. Little did we know how successful this program was going to become! In the beginning the students often took two years to achieve success in each academic year. Now that is rarely the case. Students are experiencing success in so many areas and are actually getting quite competitive with each other for top marks. Our initial goal was to see students attain their primary education which meant that they would be eligible to go on to technical training or apprenticeship programs. Level (grade) 8 was our goal. Much to our delight and surprise most students began to excel and it was no longer good enough to assist them with just primary education. Thanks to our more than generous, dedicated sponsors high school was now open to them. It is with great pride we take note that in 2017 we will have two students in Form 4 – the highest level of public education.

We are pleased to announce that we will be setting up a **Higher Education Scholarship Fund** this year. We have yet to work out the fine details but we anticipate working with Susan – our Kenyan administrator – to develop the criteria for application to receive a partial scholarship for higher education.
