

Love in Action

Over the past couple of years we have revamped our philosophy for assisting orphans & vulnerable children in Kenya. To that end we are limiting any new projects to concise projects that have a clear beginning, middle and completion. This allows for clear fundraising goals so that as the money comes in the projects get the green light.

With this in mind, in October 2019 we added a new insert for our gift card campaign. It soon became obvious that the idea of purchasing shoes for children who have been treated for jiggers was going to be a very popular choice for the Christmas card campaign. Thanks



to our loyal, generous supporters we were able to purchase 237 pairs of shoes for children from six different schools & communities.

We partnered with Volunteer Jigger Africa who ran the Jiggers Clinic for 271 children. Once the children's feet (& sometimes hands) had been treated they received high quality brand new canvas shoes. with their feet soaking in a medicated
solution. Following the treatment the
students had Vaseline applied to their feet
and then each one was given their new
shoes.



Michele & Wendy were pleased to be on hand to give lacing lessons - a lot of the children had never owned lace up shoes!

At the end of the day each child received a hand written message of love & encouragement that had been written by the students and teachers in the Faith First Program at Corpus Christi Parish in Senneville. It was definitely a wonderful end to a very busy & productive day.

The Shamoni Community Well. The Challenges, the Completion & the Joyful Celebration

What a happy day it was when this community well was completed. Fortunately the final finishing details were underway when Wendy and Michelle arrived for the SFA team visit in February ensuring they could join in with the celebrations. Those who follow our Newsletters and Facebook page will remember the exciting fund raising appeal that was launched during a

great bicycle adventure by longtime supporters Gerald and Lenore. They were participants in the epic Cairo to Capetown Bike Tour in

SFA was honoured to be chosen as their charity for a water project to give back to a Kenyan community. Gerald and Lenore experienced the importance of clean accessible water in the



lives of those around them. The Shamoni community was our targeted location. Both SFA and the community are extremely grateful for this life saving project that serves one school, two churches and a population of 1,050 people. Construction of the well was due to begin in November after the normal seasonal light rains. However unusually heavy and persistent rain prevented them from breaking ground. Washed out land and roads caused the loss of life for both people and livestock before the rain passed.

The digging of the well was finally commenced in early January but a second rain related challenge appeared.







The deepening hole began to collapse inward because of the overly

saturated soil. Due to the extreme danger this presented to the workers, further digging was halted while tests for a new site began. Thanks to the diligence and persistence of Stephen Opunde - the engineer/contractor of the well company - a new site was chosen. The well was subsequently completed to the joy and relief of all involved. We have hired Stephen's Company for the vast majority of the 16 wells we have funded over the years. We are thankful that once again Stephen has completed a successful well project for SFA with safety in mind. Wendy and Michele were on site for the laying of the final layer of bricks. This was accompanied by the joyful singing of members of the community!




Timely Completion of the Kicker Academy Water Project



Kicker Academy is an Early Childhood School which serves 90 children. The school assists struggling parents who would otherwise be unable to educate their children. It admits orphans who are marginalised, forgotten and who live in lonely social isolation. SFA completed a water project at this facility to bring clean drinking water. Water is pumped up from a borehole well to an elevated storage tank. Pipes then deliver the water to taps and sinks for handwashing.

This will bring many benefits to the children and staff and improve their health immeasurably. Local river water is contaminated by toxins and infested with Shigella entero bacteria, staphylococcus,

Distributing mosquito nets, soccer uniforms and knitted dolls was possible thanks to our wonderful volunteers and donors!












The Educational Sponsorship Program Promotes Success



The 2020 visit with the students in the Educational Sponsorship Program was the enthusiastic celebration it is every year. The students are all thriving and working hard to achieve their goals. This year in particular the students seemed extra happy to receive their letters from their sponsors. They took great care and attention in writing their letters back. The Malava students are, for the most part, attending the same school and were given permission to take time off from their class work to meet with our team. The Khayega group of students came from all over the county to see us. Unfortunately many of the Khayega students were expected to be in school on the Sunday of the gathering and were only permitted to come once they had completed their exam. Many students could not come from so far away at that time of the day.







Another exception that brought about great joy this year was the return of five of our alumni. They made a great effort to come back and join us. They were all thrilled to see each other and we enjoyed watching their reunion. Henrietta came all the way from Kisumu. It was her one day off from her catering courses. She is currently doing a stage at a hotel. The older students counseled the younger ones to work hard so that they could reap the benefits of their hard work and thereby get into a technical training course, college or university just as they had done.

They advised some of our senior students on the options they may have depending on the efforts that they make in this their final year.

It was truly uplifting to see these young people who have been through our program and how they are paying it forward. They are so grownup! Susan and Esther continually counsel students as needed. They strive to assist the students to find the way and the will to stay in school despite the many challenges and demands on their time.


