

Henrietta's Success Story

A Narrative Report by Susan Nanjala

Henrietta was born on 27th August 1998. She was enrolled on our education support program on 7th December 2010, shown in photos on her first day.



She was 12 years old at the time of enrollment in class

6. She is the 6th born out of 8 children. Her father passed on when she was 3 years old. She has been under the care of her widowed mother who has always been faced with multiple health challenges. Her mother is positively living with breast Cancer and mastectomy was done. She is also living with the immunodeficiency virus. Henrietta's mother was really overburdened with a large number of children to take care of after the death of her husband and was also ailing at the time. This was the main reasons why we enrolled her on the program.

HENRIETA'S EDUCATIONAL JOURNEY BEGINS

Henrietta has remained a very good girl right from the start. She has always remained focused in her



education and was never derailed by her peers. At school, throughout her primary and high school education, we never received any report of indiscipline. She was always in school and had respect for everyone. She passed well in her primary and secondary examinations and had passion for Home Science in high School. This prompted her to pursue Catering & Hospitality as a career whereby she has completed her course and she is currently on internship.

At home, Henrietta has always been peaceful with her sickly mother. Unlike other children, we have never received complaints from her mother. Despite all challenges at home, she remained committed and dedicated to her studies. Her mother also worked hard to look for extra financial support to fully fund Henrietta's education in high school and college. Her mother has always been very supportive too and did not let her health challenges overcome her.

Henrietta in our CCTD Education Support Program:

We have seen Henrietta grow / develop from childhood to adulthood. We know her as a very disciplined girl, ever smiling and very cooperative. She is always ready to give a hand where need be especially on the side of catering during our group functions. She always keeps in touch with us by either texting or calling the office just to let us know how she is getting on and also wanting to know how other students are getting on too. She is a very polite girl and has never given us problems / disciplinary issues.

She has always appreciated the support given to her by her sponsor through SFA. She

appreciates our CCTD organization for mediating /being the linkage for her education support. She is one of our best role models and we are proud of her as an organization.


With her career in catering & hospitality, her customers will receive the best treatment and care.


A Sponsor Shares her Experience
